

16 day tour to Lima, Cusco, Valle Sagrado, Machu Picchu, Aguas Calientes, Puerto Maldonado (Amazon) & Puno

Come with us to experience the highlights of both natural beauty and cultures in Peru including the cosmopolitan, bustling, and inspiring city of Lima, the world's most enigmatic archaeological treasures of Machu Picchu, living small town of Cusco and the tour to Amazon, a marvel of the world and the imagination, an ecosystem of unrivalled size and diversity, and a place of near mythical status among travellers.....you then explore Lake Titicaca the world's highest navigable lake, the legendary birthplace of the Inca Empire and also the home of the **Bolivian Navy!**



Australia ★ Lima

Today fly from Australia to Lima, the capital city of Peru. Arrive on the same day. Upon arrival, met and transferred to check in your hotel. Overnight in Lima.

Lima Today you will have half day Lima City Tour. The tour will begin with an exploration of Colonial Lima. First, you will stop at the Main Square where you can explore the square and admire the exteriors of the Government Palace, the Cathedral of Lima, and the City Hall, all examples of Lima's still-present colonial architectural opulence. You will visit the Cathedral of Lima, you'll travel to the past and discover various architectural styles (from Renaissance to Neo-Classical) and learn about the religious history of Peru. Our tour continues to visit San Francisco Convent built in the 17th century, and its "Catacombs" - ancient underground cemetery of Lima. Afterwards, we will head to the Pueblo Libre District and visit the Larco Museum, an eighteenth-century viceregal mansion that houses more than 3,000 years of Peru's pre-Columbian history. The museum boasts a supremely fine collection of gold and silver jewellery and worship paraphernalia that demonstrates the superb skill of ancient Peruvian gold and silversmiths. The Larco Museum also contains a famous collection of erotic ceramic tomb art that gives insights into various aspects of pre-Columbian sexuality.

Finally, you will head to the most traditional of the residential zones of the capital: San Isidro and Miraflores. You will pass through the heart of the city's financial district in San Isidro and visit Miraflores, a perfect spot to enjoy the wonderful views of the Pacific Ocean. Return to hotel and dinner served at the hotel.

Day 3 Lima ★ Cusco

In the morning, you are transferred to the airport for your flight to Cusco. Upon arrival, met and transferred to your hotel. In the afternoon you will visit the Cathedral, considered the best repository of colonial art from the Cusco school and the circuit to Qoricancha ("court of gold", also known as the temple of the Sun), the religious and political centre of Cusco during the Inca era. Just outside the city is Sacsayhuaman ("speckled falcon"), the fortress above Cusco whose precise zigzags of massive stone remains unmoved by the centuries. This is the centre of the ceremonies for the famous Inti Raymi festival. Continue your visit to San Pedro Market, which is one-stop shopping for the traveller from grocery to souvenir; though the Mercado Central is largely dedicated for fruits, vegetables, meats and bread. Return to your hotel to rest. Overnight in Cusco.

Day 4 Cusco 🖷 Valle Sagrado

Meal: B/L/D

Full day tour to Sacred Valley (Pisac market and Ollantaytambo)

You will visit Pisac, a picturesque town located 19.8 miles or 32 km. northeast of Cusco. It is famous for its colonial Church, where masses in Quechua are held every Sunday. In the colourful fairs you can find all sorts of handicrafts and the most important are the textiles and ceramic goods such as ceremonial goblets called "Q'eros", plates, ashtrays, necklace and replicas of pre-Hispanic pottery. After lunch, you will visit the remarkable fortress of Ollantaytambo, built by the Incas, also known as Temple Hill. The main access to the ceremonial centre is a series of stairways that climb to the top of the terrace complex. At this point, the site is



divided into three main areas: the Middle sector, directly in front of the terraces; the Temple sector, to the south; and the Funerary sector, to the north.

Return back to hotel in late afternoon and overnight in Valle Sagrado.


Day 5 Valle Sagrado 🚇 Machu Picchu 🚍 Aguas Calientes Meal: B/L/D Full day Machu Picchu tour (with Vistadome train)

Transfer to the train station and board Vistadome train that goes through the Urubamba Valley or Sacred Valley of the Incas, to the fabulous mountaintop ruins of Machu Picchu. Machu Picchu was never discovered by the Spaniards. For centuries it was buried in the jungle until Hiram Bingham found it in 1911.

The Holy City of Machu Picchu was built in stone among the flanks of two hills belonging to the eastern mountain range of the Andes, descending into the Amazonian upper sylvan. There is no doubt that Machu Picchu represents an extraordinary example of architecture and engineering.

Upon arrival at the station, you will take coach transfer to the top of the ruins (30 minutes) and take a guided tour of the ruins. Return to the hotel. Overnight in Aguas Calientes





Day 6 Aguas Calientes # Machu Picchu Meal: B/D

In the morning you could re-visit Machu Picchu with second entrance and bus ticket by yourselves (guide not included); then take Vistadome train back to Cusco and transfer back to hotel.

Dinner served at the hotel and overnight in Cusco.

Day 7 Cusco Meal: B

Day is at leisure. Cusco, a nice small town has a lot to offer. You could leisurely explore more of the beautiful small town at your own pace.

Overnight in Cusco.

Day 8 Cusco ⊀ Puerto Maldonado ≜ Hacienda Concepcion Meal: B/L/D Transfer to airport for your flight to Puerto

Maldonado for your Amazon Package.

Hacienda Concepción - Program 4 days / 3

Upon arrival in Puerto Maldonado and check in at the Inkaterra Lounge (Butterfly House). Navigate by outboard motorized canoe along the Madre de Dios River to Inkaterra Hacienda Concepcion (approximately 25-minute navigation). After enjoying your lunch with organic ingredients and



native flavors, you will take a walk through Concepcion Trails, our inside property nature trails, where you will discover and learn about primary and secondary rainforest, its components, uses, transformations by the human being, and its relevance for the world. At dusk navigate by outboard motorized canoe, at the Twilight River excursion. Sailing on the Madre de Dios River, you will learn about its ecosystem, Amazonian creeks, nocturnal animals' behavior, and the southern constellations. In the evening enjoy a nice dinner at the dining room in the Casa Grande. Overnight at Hacienda Concepción.

Day 9 Hacienda Concepción Meal: B/L/D After breakfast get ready for a long trek through terra firma into the Tambopata National Reserve towards Lake Sandoval. Here you will understand why Madre de Dios is called the biodiversity capital of Peru, while learning about the Reserve's conservation efforts and the lake's formation. Navigate by dugout canoe across this mirror-like oxbow lake that is home to the endangered giant river otter (Pteronura brasiliensis), blue and vellow macaw (Ara ararauna), red howler monkey (Alouatta seniculus), black caiman (Melanosuchus niger), and one of the world's biggest fresh water scaled fish - the paiche (Arapaima gigas).

Back to the lodge for lunch and later on the Inkaterra Canopy Walkway & Anaconda Walk wait for you. Take a 20-minute ride by outboard motorized canoe to the Inkaterra Canopy Walkway Interpretation Center where you will learn about its construction and the conservation projects of ITA-Inkaterra Association (NGO), Ascend one of the two 98-foot towers (30 m.) and cross the 7 hanging bridges that connect the treetops at 91 ft. high (28 m.). Enjoy the breathtaking vistas and get the chance to watch whitethroated toucans (Ramphastos tucanus), woodpeckers, trogons, squirrel monkeys (Saimiri boliviensis) and the three-toed sloth (Choleopus hoffmani). After descending, keep on feeling the incredible primary rainforest energy going along the 200-meter wooden bridge over the aguajales swamps. You will learn about the fauna and flora of this flooded ecosystem.

At night get ready for an adventure at the Hidden Rainforest excursion, where you will explore the Amazon rainforest that gives way to nocturnal animals who display intriguing behavior patterns, and enhanced senses as adaptation mechanisms. Listen to nocturnal



living nature sounds, and penetrate this hidden world. Return to the lodge and enjoy a nice dinner. Overnight at Hacienda Concepción.

Day 10 Hacienda Concepción

Meal: B/I/D

After an early breakfast, you will take Native Farm excursion to learn the local techniques of cultivation and taste some of the products. After lunch, you will have a rest before we start the COCHA Water excursion. Enjoy a dugout canoe ride on the Inkaterra Hacienda Concepcion Cocha Lake. Try native fishing applying the "catch and release" techniques, as you enjoy the scenery observing hoatzins (Opisthocomus hoazin), a diversity of fly catchers, and gray-necked woodrails (Aramides cajanea). Disembark at the remains of Fitzcarrald steam boat; learn about its history and how it inspired Inkaterra to ask Werner Herzog to film the award-winning "Fitzcarraldo", best director at Cannes, 1982. You will be able to participate in the Inland Collpa during the evening, where you will see different species and their night routines by observing through our "blinds". Overnight at Hacienda Concepción.

Day 11 Hacienda Concepcion Puerto Maldonado ★ Puno Meal: B

After breakfast, take a boat ride back to Puerto Maldonado for your flight to Puno via Cusco; upon arrival Puno, met and transferred to your hotel.

Day 12 Puno – Lake Titicaca

Meal: B/L

Full day tour to Uros Islands and Taquile Islands by shared boat.

You will visit Uros islands, which are made of reeds and anchored by logs and connected to each other by ropes. The local people rely on fishing and selling handcrafts to visitors. Continue to Taquile Island which has two essential characteristics - its geography of offering a spectacular view from its hills and first-rate textile. Taquileños live on their textile activities; this can easily be seen the

men walking in rubber sandals ("ojotas" in quechua) with black pants, white flannel shirts and beautiful fine woven chumpis (belts), and covering their heads with finely knitted warm "chullos" (caps with ear flaps). Overnight in Puno.

Day 13 Puno Meal: B/L

In the morning, you will visit Puno city including the Main Square, the Cathedral, Dreyer Museum, Deustua Arc, Huajsapata Hill, Municipal Theatre Mural and the Local Artesanal Market . After lunch, you will head to Sillustani, a pre-Incan burial ground on the shores of Lake Umayo. The tombs, which are built above ground in tower-like structures called chullpas, are the vestiges of the Colla people, Aymara who were conquered by the Inca in the 15th century. The structures housed the remains of complete family groups, although they were probably limited to nobility. Many of the tombs have been dynamited by grave robbers, while others were left unfinished. Overnight in Puno.

Day 14 Puno ⊀Lima Meal: B

You will have a leisure morning. In time, you are transferred to the airport for your flight to Lima. Upon arrival Lima, you are transferred to check in hotel.

Day 15 Lima ★ Australia Meal: R This morning is at leisure. In time transfer to the airport for your flight bound for Australia.

Day 16 Australia

Arrive in Australia in the morning.


